«Al ver la estrella, se llenaron de inmensa alegría»
(Mt 2,10)

Querida hermana, querido hermano:

Al entrar en el tiempo de Adviento, la cita de Mateo es, en el verdadero sentido de la palabra, iluminadora. Desearía que la metáfora de la estrella presentada a continuación nos ayude en este momento litúrgico particular y, más aún, se convierta en un estilo de vida en nuestro camino terrenal hacia el encuentro con el Amado.

Las estrellas aparecen en el cielo durante la noche, cuando está oscuro y hace frío, y no durante el día. Caminamos en un contexto histórico complejo y en continua evolución. Además de las guerras reales, estamos viendo un generalizado lenguaje conflictual a nivel político, social y eclesial.

Cito una expresión que el Papa Francisco formuló explícitamente por vez primera en 2019, incluso antes de la pandemia, con motivo de las felicitaciones navideñas a la Curia romana: «Lo que estamos viviendo no es simplemente una época de cambios, sino que es un cambio de época».

De esta afirmación, parece que no se trate solamente de acontecimientos ya vistos a lo largo de la historia, sino de un mundo que está dejando su sitio a otro, por lo tanto, de certezas que resultan inciertas y de estabilidad que se vuelve fluida. Esta dialéctica está afectando a las religiones, a la política, a la moral, a las instituciones y a la visión del ser humano con sus derechos y sus deberes.

Los creyentes en Jesús ciertamente no somos inmunes a todo esto, pero alentados por las palabras del Apóstol, «no estén tristes como los que no tienen esperanza» (1Ts 4,13), podemos crecer en la conciencia de nuestra vocación y, con Su ayuda, transformar este momento en una oportunidad, para testimoniar que vivimos en el mundo, pero que ya pertenecemos al Reino que nos aguarda.

En este contexto precisamente estamos llamados a marcar la diferencia y a vivir nuestra esperanza plena y comunitariamente. De hecho, sabemos y creemos que Jesús es el Señor de la historia y Él es quien la guía hacia su fin último, como Él mismo dice: «Yo soy el Alfa y la Omega, el principio y el fin, el primero y el último» (Ap 22,13).

Por eso, cuando oscurece y el Sol de justicia parece lejano, Él no nos abandona, sino que nos guía a través de la estrella que, para quienes levantan la cabeza y miran hacia ella, es fuente de gozo y de seguridad, una seguridad animada por la confianza de que, a pesar de la adversidad, permanecemos en Él y dependemos de Él.

La estrella es Su Palabra, la cual es capaz de iluminar, guiar, sanar y crear lo que aún no existe. La estrella son Sus promesas, y nosotros, Koinonía Juan Bautista, encarnamos junto con la Iglesia y en la Iglesia, de modo profético, el “ya” de las verdades inmutables y el “todavía no” de lo nuevo que viene. La estrella es fuente de alegría, porque brillando en la oscuridad nos recuerda que somos un pueblo en camino, que se abre a la esperanza de lo que le espera: «Mirad que realizo algo nuevo; ya está brotando, ¿no lo notáis? Abriré un camino en el desierto, corrientes en el yermo» (Is 43, 18b-19)..

Queridos, el tiempo de Adviento es el tiempo de la Palabra proclamada, orada y vivida a nivel personal y a nivel comunitario, conscientes de que después de la noche viene el día, después de los dolores de parto viene el nacimiento. Por tanto, dejémonos guiar por la estrella porque no es solamente un astro, sino también la meta de nuestro camino: «Yo soy la raíz y la descendencia de David, la estrella radiante de la mañana» (Ap 22,16).

¡No me queda más que desearos un fecundo camino de Adviento, una feliz Navidad y un próspero año nuevo!

“They were overjoyed at seeing the star”
(Matt 2:10)

Dearest sister, dearest brother,

Entering the season of Advent, this verse from Matthew is enlightening, in the truest sense of the word. I would like that the metaphor of the guiding star help us during this special liturgical time and not only, becoming a lifestyle in our earthly journey towards our encounter with the Beloved.

The stars appear in the sky at nighttime, when it is dark and cold. They aren't visible during the day. We are living in a complex and ever-changing historical context. As well as real wars, we are witnessing widespread conflictual language at a political, social and ecclesial level

I wish to share with you a reflection given by Pope Francis for the first time in 2019 (before the pandemic), in his Christmas greetings to the Roman Curia: “what we are experiencing is not simply an epoch of changes, but an epochal change”.

From this statement, it seems that it isn't simply a matter of events that we've already seen in the course of history, but of one world giving way to another. Certainties that now turn out to be not certain, and stabilities that are becoming fluid. This dialectic tension is affecting religions, politics, morality, institutions, and the vision of man, with his rights and responsibilities.

As believers in Jesus, we are certainly not immune to all of this. However, motivated by the words of the Apostle, “do not grieve as others do who have no hope” (1 Thes 4:13), we can grow in awareness of our call and, with Jesus' help, turn this moment into an opportunity: by testifying that we live in the world, but that we already belong to the Kingdom that awaits us.

It is in this context that we are called to make a difference and to live our hope, in its fullness and as a community. In fact, we know and believe that Jesus is the Lord of history, and He leads time and history towards its ultimate end, as He Himself says: “I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End” (Rev 22:13).

So, even when it is dark and the Sun of Righteousness seems far away, He doesn't abandon us. Rather, He guides us by the star that, for those who lift their head and look at it, is the source of joy and assurance. This assurance is animated by the trust that, despite the difficulties, we live in Him and depend on Him.

This star is His Word, which illuminates, guides, heals, and creates that which doesn't yet exist. The star is His promises and, in a prophetic way, we as Koinonia John the Baptist, together with the Church and in the Church, embody the ‘already’ of immutable and enduring truth as well as the ‘not yet’ of the new reality which is still to come. The star is the source of joy: by shining in the darkness, it reminds us that we are a people on a journey, on the move, and opens us to the hope of what awaits us: “I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert” (Is 43:19)..

Dearest friends, the season of Advent is the season of the Word proclaimed, prayed, and lived at both a personal and community level, knowing that after the night comes the dawn, and after the pains of labour comes the new birth. Let's allow ourselves to be guided by the star. It isn't only an object in space, but also the goal of our journey: “I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star” (Rev 22:16).

All that remains for me to do is to wish you a fruitful Advent journey, a joyful Christmas and a prosperous New Year!




